he Gospels for the next two Sundays are again giving us an insight into what Jesus was teaching to the people who came to hear him as he followed the slow winding path to his ultimate goal, Jerusalem. He, and he alone, knew what awaited him at journey's end. Sometime he spoke to the crowds in plain language, but more often than not he used parables.

In these particular passages he is trying to tell Israel that, when it comes to being 'saved' they cannot claim any special privileges because of their ties of Jewish blood with Jesus. Everyone will be judged by their actions, even the Chosen People.

Jesus is stressing that his ministry is not just for Israel, it is for the whole world. As he says, 'men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God'. This is a specific reference to the Gentiles, to all people of faith.

Jesus is particularly keen to stress that anyone pushing themselves forward and wanting to be noticed will not gain any favours. We all know how much we dislike that type of behaviour when we encounter it. Much better to put first those who are currently last. Better to invite the poor and the crippled to your table than the rich and famous. The message is clear—we can't earn salvation but we do have to ask for it!
