One of the many new words and sayings that has entered our vocabulary with the coronavirus is the expression the 'new normal'. Its sense could be taken as meaning what changes and new ways of doing things might we have to adopt personally and socially - with the coming of the coronavirus? How will 'normal' life be lived differently than before? For us as Christians this is not the first 'new normal'. Since the coming of Jesus Christ into this world - his birth, death, and resurrection - followers of Jesus have been living with a 'new normal'. We no longer live as 'sheep without a shepherd' but as sons and daughters of the Eternal Father united in his Son, Jesus Christ, the Saviour and light of the World. Today, with the Feast of Pentecost we give thanks that we do not follow Jesus just with our own strength - which would be impossible - but that he has sent the Holy Spirit to fill, strengthen and guide us in this world. The Holy Spirit transformed the Apostles and first disciples and how much we need to desire and pray for this today. We are not made to live alone, but to be open to and filled with God's Spirit. Supernatural faith, hope and love transforms us, transforms our way of living and our relationships with others.

With God's creative Spirit we can pray to make our own and to live as our 'new normal' this prayer attributed to St Francis: 'Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is discord, union; where there is error, truth. Where there is doubt, let me bring faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, your light; where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; in self-forgetting that we find; in pardoning that we are pardoned; and in dying that we are born to eternal life.'

May this same Holy Spirit who filled the first Apostles with his presence and joy and so renewed the face of the earth do likewise for us today. How we and the world need him. God bless you this week, Fr Bruno

5th anniversary of Laudato Si......

The Bishops reflect on the call given by Pope Francis in his Encyclical Letter, *Laudato Si*, issued on 24th May 2015, Pentecost Day.

As we celebrate Pentecost this year, we are acutely aware of the damage that continues to be inflicted on the Earth, and the repercussions for our brothers and sisters especially, in the poorest countries of the world. Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have both taught us that everything is interconnected and interdependent. How we live our everyday lives has an impact on everyone and on the earth. The urgency of the situation, and the enormity of the challenges we face, have spurred us to speak out about the role that the Catholic Church and our faith must play in our shared care for God's gift to us. We cannot leave it to industry and governments. We all have a part to play, each and every one of us in the routines, choices and decisions of our everyday lives and our aspirations for the future.

In all our human endeavours, we need the presence of the Holy Spirit, "the Lord, the Giver of Life", whose gift to the Church and the world we celebrate again at Pentecost. Let us keep this Feast with that enduring hope that we can begin to repair the damage we have done and provide a healthy home for future generations. Our hope will be strengthened by our prayer. May our constant request be that the Holy Spirit guide us, strengthen our resolve and 'renew the face of the earth'.
