I once had an insignificant, but memorable experience. It was Yom Kippur, on the Mount of the Beatitudes – I was there with the rest of the seminary, and we were asked to spend the day in silence. I remember the beautiful and lush garden at the top, green palm fronds and coloured flowers spilling down onto the bare yellow rock, and plunging towards the impossible blue of the Sea of Galilee, whose wide expanse was checked by towering ochre cliffs on the far shore. Not much has changed since Jesus's day, when He went fishing with the disciples in that lake, and yes, even walked on its surface.

I ought to have felt a deep sense of connection to God. But I didn't. Actually, I felt nothing but bored and fed up – and on top of that, annoyed at myself for having those feelings. Looking around at my brother seminarians walking in the garden, praying here and there, I imagined that they were all having all kinds of amazing religious experiences, and I felt stupid and jealous. Not for the last time!

For want of anything better to do, I opened my Bible at the beginning of Mark's Gospel. Still bored, I read a little, and then stopped. The very first words Jesus utters are: "The time has come, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Good News." It was just then that I realised. Jesus had not brought me to this special place to have some kind of wonderful feeling. He wanted me to be sorry for my sins, and turn to Him. With calmness, I breathed out, and went to Confession.

I said at the start that I was going to tell you about an 'insignificant' one, and I hope that you can see how true that was – they're never going to make a film about it! But it was not insignificant for me. No word received from Christ to a sinful heart ever could be so. It took me from a state of sin, to a state of grace – a journey I have had to make so many times since. It was a great reminder to me that in the Christian life, most of the time we do not experience anything spectacular, but that does not mean that the Word does not constantly speak. Jesus's words are useless unless they are heard! It is very same passage that I read from the start of Mark that the Church invites us to hear in the liturgy this Sunday, which Pope Francis has designated the 'Sunday of the Word of God'. Put down your nets, pick up the Word, and let it speak to you this week too: 'Repent, and believe in the Good News.'
