The texts of this week's Mass are clear, and challenging. They warn us that in no way should the life of our bodies outweigh our consideration for our souls, particularly when we subjugate others in order to get rich or live more comfortably. It is better to cut off a hand, than to sin with it and go to hell, He says. Meanwhile St James concurs that by amassing wealth, which corrodes, our bodies will be corroded in the same way. These strong words remind us of the frequent image in the Bible defining sin as a kind of slavery, since it results from the mentality that we can take matters into our own hands to "create" happiness for ourselves, in this life: even though death is unavoidable. Being enslaved to this mentality in fact destroys the possibility of happiness, because we will be locked into a life desperately searching for fulfilment, which we simply won't find in pleasures, that quickly pass away. Rather, Jesus proposes a life of service to God and neighbour, which frees us by opening us to receive His love, love that survives even death, in the kingdom of Heaven.

In light of the feast of Our Lady of Ransom, which we celebrated on Friday, Jesus' words this week have particular resonance for us. Medieval Europe was in a state of intermit-tent warfare between the Christian kingdoms of southern Europe and the Muslim states of North Africa, Southern France, Sicily and portions of Spain. Many Christians on the Mediterranean coast found themselves captured in raids and carries off to Africa as slaves. In August 1218, St Peter Nolasco experienced a vision of the Virgin Mary, asking him to found a religious order dedicated to rescuing them. Today, we pray to Our Lady to ask her Son, who ransomed us by the Cross, to free us from the slavery of sin, and to strive for a life lived in humble service of the Church. We also pray for all the innocent, who even in this age are ensnared by traffickers, and taken against their will: this time, from Africa, to the European coast.
