The description of the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman is a rarity because of its length and its detail. There are not many face-to-face, one-to-one meetings that Jesus had with the people he countered which are described so vividly. Often we are told about what Jesus is preaching but this time, there he is, tired and, one feels, perhaps a little low spirited, engaging in conversation with the Samaritan woman. This in itself would be unusual, a Jew asking a Samaritan for a drink, but then, Jesus was unusual, as the woman was about to find out.

It is also a very visual meeting. We can picture the trodden path to the well, the blue sky, the heat and that special well donated by Jacob, filled with clear water, the water which is the spiritual analogy. Jesus wants a drink from the well but he also is the source of another type of water: "Anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again." The living water to which Jesus refers is the whole of our spiritual inner life which allows us to become true worshippers of the Father, to be the kind of worshipper the Father wants. When they talk about worship in a somewhat mystical way the woman seems to understand him. She certainly know what he means by worshipping in spirit and in truth. It seems that from the moment of their meeting the unnamed woman is immediately involved in what Jesus has to say. She questions him eagerly— and believes him. She knows that the Messiah is coming, and when Jesus declares "I am he" she has no doubt. Indeed she gives testimony to all her townspeople. Let us pray that we too will receive that water of eternal life, that essential gift which we cannot live without.
