When Jesus tells his disciples that the sickness of Lazarus will end not in death but in the glory of God and of the Son of God, we get the feeling that he is deliberately waiting, for his own reasons, before going to Lazarus’ bedside.

When Martha comes to meet him she tells him that if he had come earlier her brother would not **have died**, but she believes that Christ will work some miracle. However, she misunderstands when he says that he is the resurrection and the life, thinking he is talking about the last day. How can she know that he is foreshadowing his own death and resurrection.

We are told that Jesus, at this point, appears very distressed. Is this because, although people declare their belief in him, they do not understand the whole truth, they cannot comprehend who he really is. Jesus prays to the Father and makes it very clear that this is a public pronouncement ‘for the sake of those who stand round me, that they may believe it was you who sent me.’ It is only then that he calls to Lazarus.

When we connect all the Gospels we listen to throughout Lent, leading up to the Passion and Resurrection, we realise how publicly Jesus worked his miracles—and his reason for so doing. The Samaritan woman rushed into town to tell all the people about her encounter with him. When the blind man was quizzed by the Pharisees about how his sight was restored he told them about his belief in Jesus. Now the crowds present at the rising of Lazarus give testimony to their conversion. That faith, spread initially by word of mouth, comes directly to us so that we too can say ‘I believe’ and, although we did not see the miracles, that legacy of faith is ours to treasure.

Fr Raglan writes: These are unusual times and one sign of it is the quietness of roads with traffic and pavements with hardly anyone on them. It is as if the Lord has placed us all in a kind of desert for Lent. Laurentia Johns, a Benedictine nun began a weekly reflection in The Tablet on the first Sunday of Lent with thoughts that have turned out to be startlingly prophetic. We can rejoice at the sudden peace and equally suddenly find that it reveals disturbing feelings inside ourselves. Coronavirus has indeed, as she puts it, "thrust..solitude and silence..upon us". She encourages us to stick with it and pray for the grace of acceptance.

### **PALM SUNDAY**

Palms will be left for the public outside the entrance to OLR; why not mark the day at home by reading the account of the Passion (Mt 26:14-27:66)?

**THIS WEEK LET US PRAY** in particular for frontline health workers, especially our fellow parishioners who care for the sick at the DGH, surgeries, the Hospice and in care homes: "Wondrous God, author of life, you fashioned us in your likeness and breathed into us the life which is your own. Be with those whose special care is the health of mind and body. Fill their hearts with awe for the life which is your gift and sustain them daily in your service, that their hands may bring to others the comfort of your healing touch. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
