THE PARISH OF OUR LADY OF RANSOM St GREGORY AND St AGNES

Readings from the Acts of the Apostles are always interesting and enlightening, showing us how the disciples carried out the legacy, the mission, which Christ had left them.

This week's passage is particularly insightful. Somehow one never thinks of actually how Saul managed to join the disciples but this week we are told the story. Remember Saul's dreadful reputation as the

persecutor of Christians and then he metaphorically turns up on the disciples' doorstep. No wonder they were afraid of him. After all he was the man who had asked for letters addressed to the synagogues that would authorise him to arrest and take to Jerusalem any followers of Christ that he might find, be they men or women. It was brave Barnabas who took Saul in hand, vouched for his credentials and explained about his conversion on the road to Damascus, his subsequent blindness after seeing the light from heaven and hearing the voice of the Lord and his baptism. So he started preaching in Jerusalem but opponents of the new Christian movement vowed to kill him, so the brothers, as they now were, sent him to Tarsus. It is interesting that this passage ends with the implication that once the fiery Paul had left, the churches in a large region were now left in peace filled with the Holy Spirit.
