n Thursday we celebrate one of the great after-Easter feast days, the Ascension of our Lord. In the past weeks, since the Resurrection, we have listened to accounts of Jesus' appearances to various of his disciples, encounters which seem to be private and personal to his chosen followers, not the crowd-pulling events of his life before the crucifixion. It is almost as though Jesus is giving them time to absorb all the information he gave them at the Last Supper and to make sure that they have absorbed his message. He is leaving them, but not forever. "I will not leave you orphaned". Today's Gospel follows on directly from the one we listened to last Sunday, all part of the warning he gave them that he would soon be leaving the physical part of his time on earth. "In a little while the world will no longer see me". But the reassurance, which he constantly gives them, is that he will be with them. Not only does he promise that they will live, because he lives, he also promises them that help is at hand. "I shall ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever". He is of course referring to the third member of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit.

We can take comfort from the fact that Jesus "rose in glory" and left behind for us the instruction to keep his commandments. Then he will know he is loved and will love us in return. The Ascension should be looked on as a pause in a narrative. Christ came to save us and left us all the signposts we need and the promise that he will never desert us. That promise, particularly in stressful times like these, is one we should keep close to our hearts.
