Last week, Jesus warned us that sinners who refuse to listen to reason, or refuse God's mercy, risk putting themselves, by their own free choice, out of the Church. But that's not the end of the story! He goes on this week to teach that God's mercy is greater than we can imagine. The Father is compared to a king who is able to forgive the debt of a vast sum of money: a sum beyond imagining, that could never really be paid back. St Thomas Aquinas points out that every single thing God does for us involves mercy, because He pours upon each person more gifts than he could ever deserve. Moreover, Jesus's gift of self on the Cross the gift by which he paid the debt of our sin, is totally unmerited, and cannot be matched by any offering we can make: the worship of the Word made Flesh speaking to the Father with whom He is one.

If God can be so generous, who I am to refuse mercy to my neighbour? That's the upshot of Jesus's teaching on sin and repentance. We pray each day: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." This means that when we are hurt by others, God wishes us to be the instruments of His forgiveness, extending out beyond the world's logic of titfor-tat. To be a victim who forgives, in union with Jesus, the Saving Victim, humbles the proud and strong, and rehabilitates those who have hurt and yet cannot forgive themselves, who are surely the more to be pitied. Better by far in God's eyes to be injured, than to injure – for then, we are just like Christ. Extending a hand of mercy to those who have done us wrong breaks the cycle of vengeance and enmity and contributes to the establishment of Christ's kingdom of Love. Many of the saints can inspire us to take this difficult path: St Maria Goretti, for example, who forgave her attacker, resulting in his conversion. To forgive even little things in others is to bless them, but also to receive a blessing for oneself, for it involves recognising our own inadequacy, our own radical need for forgiveness and healing. As Jesus also said: "Blessed are the merciful for they shall receive mercy".

COLLECTIONS: There is a retiring collection for Holy Places this weekend 12th/13th September.

This collection should have taken place on Good Friday. On that day when we solemnly remember Christ's Passion, we also go back to a tradition that began in 1219. St. Francis of Assisi had crossed over to Egypt determining to join the 5th Crusade, except instead of a sword he wished to offer the hand of friendship. He met with the Muslim Viceroy, Malek al Kamil, and they discussed their respective faiths and belief in God. As a result, care of the Holy Places in the Muslim controlled areas of the Holy Land were given into the custodianship of the Franciscan Order. The two men began an enduring friendship, and there is a touching footnote to their relationship: in 1224 Francis composed his 'Canticle of the Creatures', a celebration of God's grace in all creation. But there was a note found added to the manuscript, "oh my brother, how my heart is heavy...". This is thought to refer to a planned campaign by the Crusaders, which Francis knew threatened the life of his friend al Kamil.
