Grace is the freely given "gift that God makes to us of his own life, infused by the Holy Spirit into our soul to heal it of sin and to sanctify it" (CCC 1999). The concept of grace helps us to understand the *hiddenness* of the kingdom of God as described in Matthew 13. God begins to live in me, and I in God, leading my life to be fragrant with Him, in other words, to 'holiness'. Grace is a buried treasure, and holiness a precious pearl; they are within our grasp, but we must sacrifice ourselves in order to attain them. This is because grace comes to us *through* Jesus – and to receive it will mean that we, too, have to walk with him the way of His sacrifice and His death, to come to glory.

This journey is exactly what the Angelus prayer asks for: "Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts; that we, to whom the incarnation of Christ, Thy Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of His Resurrection, through the same Christ Our Lord." Furthermore, it asks for it along with the powerful intercession of Our Lady. 'Full of grace', Mary really is, in a way, Jesus's kingdom. She is like the field containing a hidden treasure: her glorious Son. Even though outwardly, her life seemed rather ordinary – that of a wife and mother – the Lord's will saturated everything she did. Her 'yes' to God is the pearl of great price, which she obtained by casting everything else aside: a word of joy, but also of sacrifice, as the love with which she uttered it brought her directly into the agony of the Crucifixion. Dying to ourselves each day can be painful. It feels like we have committed ourselves to an empty field; we need faith to remember that there is treasure within. Making the Angelus prayer with Mary, morning, noon, and evening, can help us stay focussed every day on the prize, which lies, for the most part, beyond this life.
