The Feast of the Trinity is not something we could have invented ourselves. It was through Jesus Christ that the first disciples were shown who the Father is, and then at Pentecost they experienced the Spirit who brings God’s presence to us throughout our lives. It is a ‘mystery’, but this does not mean it has no effect on practical living. The Trinity cannot be proved like other objects around us. But it shows us that the nature of God is relationship, and that relationship is the essential mark of the entire universe. So in Baptism we begin a spiritual journey: being drawn into the ‘family’ of God, learning that everything in some way has a ‘family resemblance’ to God. On our part we have to allow that divine life to take over in us. What we call sin is when we block it out from flowing in and around us. But God can use our sorrow, and in the sacraments (especially Reconciliation), the Spirit brings the presence of the Son to set up ‘home’ in us. The Son, sent by the Father of mercy, renews our life just as He himself died and rose to new life.

PREPARING THE INTERCESSIONS AT MASS

In the current situation with church
buildings still closed, there is even more
importance in the prayer that we offer as
Christians: for those affected by
Coronavirus, and those with responsibility
for overcoming it. There is a long tradition
to this intercession. St. Paul gives us a
picture of the early Church: "I urge then,
first of all that petitions, prayers,
intercessions and thanksgiving should be
offered for everyone, for kings and others
in authority, so that we may be able to live
peaceful and quiet lives with all devotion
and propriety. To do this is right, and
acceptable to God our Saviour; he wants
everyone to be saved and to reach full
knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2: 1-
4). As the Mass began to take the shape
we would recognise today, this prayer was
a key element, praying for the salvation of
all just before going to to recall Christ's
sacrifice in the Eucharistic Prayer.

With Ann Smiley having sadly died, we
have lost a major part of our team who
compose the intercessions (bidding
prayers) for Sunday Mass. Do you think
you could be part of this? You would only
need to take a turn on a rota, and the more
people who are part of this, the less it will
bear on each person. We can give you the
Church's guidelines for the issues we
should have in mind, and the way to
structure the prayers. *Fr. Raglan*

THE ALPHA COURSE

At the beginning of the year we advertised
another instalment of the Alpha course
which introduces people to Jesus Christ,
and has transformed people's lives over 30
years. We had a group signed up and then
came the lockdown, on the very day
(March 24th) that we were due to start!

But one challenge in these times is to
decide which things in our lives are
really essential. Do we always need a
building to carry out the Church's role
of prayer, mission and formation? Do
we put off everything until the end of
the current restrictions, or can we
take up the challenge of doing the
same things but in a different way?
We have begun, like many other
parishes, to hold discussion groups
and share spiritual ideas using the
Internet. Now the Alpha team is
exploring how we can conduct a
course online. The positive aspect is
that there may even be people who
are more comfortable making their
first entry into religion in that way.
Please pray about this: that we can
master the technology, and above all
that the we will be guided and
inspired by the Holy Spirit.
